WHAT WE DO

LWB US supports public libraries and community organizations to identify and remove barriers **preventing underserved communities** from accessing the knowledge and resources to pursue more promising futures.

WHY WE DO IT

With over 17,000 branches across the US, public libraries serve as **lifelines to education**, **resources**, **and social connection**. Yet, fundamental barriers stemming from historic neglect and systematic racism prevent communities who would benefit most from accessing the library's most vital resources. Simultaneously, many libraries face structural and logistical limitations that inhibit their capacity for outreach and innovation.

That's where LWB US comes in: creating sustainable solutions that bring resources, knowledge, and power outside the library walls and into local communities.

Guiding a comprehensive internal and external assessment of library offerings and community needs to inform a strategic plan in Newark, New Jersey.

CULTURAL COMMUNITY ARCHIVE

Preserving and protecting the rich cultural heritage in Loiza, Puerto Rico by capturing oral histories and cultural assets through community-driven digital archive training and technical support.

NEW LIBRARY-SCHOOL PARTNERSHIP INITIATIVE

In 2024, LWB US launched one of our largest efforts yet to connect students, families, and educators to local library offerings.

We successfully piloted this model in ten communities across New Jersey, New York, Colorado, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Illinois, and Maine and will expand the program in the year ahead building on these promising strategies:

Hosting awareness campaigns to promote local library services and offerings

Offering library programming, events, and workshops on-site at schools

Launching selfcheckout stations to enable a seamless library access at school Facilitating collection sharing between libraries and school systems


Total Revenue	\$1,507,470
